THIS IS A SPECIFIC VERSION OF THE WORKING TIME RULES THAT AFFECT EUREGULATED DRIVERS (THE MAJORITY OF PROFESSIONAL DRIVERS IN THE UK)

DRIVERS WORKING UNDER DOMESTIC RULES ARE ALSO REGULATED BY WORKING TIME RULES, BUT THERE ARE SUBTLE DIFFERENCES IN SOME RULES





DRIVERS MUST NOT WORK FOR MORE THAN 6 CONSECUTIVE HOURS WITHOUT TAKING A BREAK



6-9 HOURS

A DRIVER WHO WORKS BETWEEN 6 TO 9 HOURS MUST TAKE A BREAK OF AT LEAST 30 MINUTES





IF A DRIVER WORKS OVER 9 HOURS THEY MUST TAKE A BREAK OF AT LEAST 45 MINUTES.



60 HOURS

THE MAXIMUM TIME THAT CAN BE WORKED IN ANY ONE WEEKLY PERIOD IS 60 HOURS



THE AVERAGE WORKING WEEK MUST NOT EXCEED

48 HOURS

## PERIODS OF AVAILABILITY

A PERIOD OF AVAILABILITY IS NOT INCLUDED IN THE CALCULATION OF WORKING TIME.

- 1. THE DRIVER MUSTN'T BE REQUIRED TO REMAIN IN THE VEHICLE/AT THE WORKSTATION
- 2. ITS DURATION MUST BE KNOWN IN ADVANCE
